

Frank Baker

Frank Baker was born on 28 August 1892 in Taunton, Somerset, England. He is the son of Charles Baker and Eunice Rowsell. Frank was christened on 9 October 1892 in Stoke St. Mary, Somerset, England.

Frank is listed with his family, on page 2, in the 31 March 1901 census for Broughton, Stoke St. Mary, Somerset, England, he is 8 of age.

In 1911 Frank is living with his mother in Broughton, Stoke St. Mary, Somerset, England. Also in the house are George, 31, Charlie Tom, 28, Alice Mary, 21, and Ada, 17.

During World War I Frank served with the Somerset Coldstream Guard. He served with Jim Brown, his future wife's brother. It is said that they served in France and were at Flander's Field.

According to their marriage record Frank Baker and Annie Brown were married on 18 February 1920 in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England

Doris May was born 4 December 1920 in Taunton, Somerset, England. Doris never married.

Frank's family has not been identified on the 1921 census. It is believed they were living in Broughton.

Annie Brown

Annie Brown was born on 11 January 1897 in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England. She is the daughter of James Brown and Mary Ellen Bagnall.

The James Brown family is living in St. Luke Parish, Blakenhall, Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England in 1901, as recorded on page 2 of the census record. Annie is 4 years old.

Charles James was born 24 October 1922 in Taunton, Somerset, England. Jim married Maureen Maria Teresa Hanson in 1949. Jim died on 13 May 2008.

Frederick George was born 13 June 1924 in Taunton, Somerset, England. George married Doreen Head. George died 28 January 2007.

Eunice Mary was born 28 August 1926 in Taunton, Somerset, England. Eunice married Daniel Elbert Baird on 1 December 1945 in Taunton, Somerset, England.

The family has not been identified in the 1931 census.

Robert Frank was born 30 March 1932 in Taunton, Somerset, England. Robert never married.

It is believed that Frank and his family lived in Broughton continuous through 1946 but may have lived in Bishop's Lydeard for awhile. Later on they moved to Milverton. Frank worked his whole live on Broughton Farm as an agricultural labourer.

Frank died on 3 May 1970 in Milverton, Taunton, Somerset, England.

The James Brown family is living at 61 Cross Street, Blakenhall, Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England at the time of the 1911 census. Living in the house are James 38, a Journeyman Tailor, Mary Ellen, 38, Annie, 14, James, 12, Ethel, 10, Nelly, 9, George Henry, 4, Horace David, 3, and Florence, 1.

Annie died on 15 March 1968 in Milverton, Taunton, Somerset, England.
