

James Brown

James Brown was born on 4 March 1873 in Wolverhampton, England the son of James Brown and Emma Price.

The census for 3 April 1881 for Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England was taken in April. The James Brown family was living on Duke Street in the Eastern Division as recorded on film #1341671. James was 8 years old and listed as a scholar. Duke Street is in Wednesfield.

James Brown is listed on the 5 April 1891 census for Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England. He is living with his family at 243 Steelhouse Lane in Wolverhampton. He is 18 years old. He is listed as a tailor.

James Brown married Mary Ellen Bagnell in about 1896. The marriage record has not yet been found.

Annie Brown was born on 11 January 1897 in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England. Her family was living at 123 Valliers Street at the time. Annie married Frank Baker on 18 February 1920 and she died on 15 March 1968 in Taunton, Somerset, England.

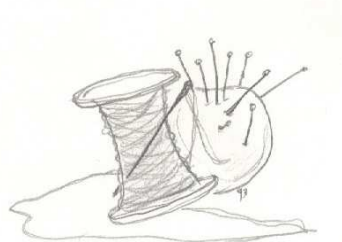
James Brown was born on 23 September 1898 in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England. James Brown married Gertrude. He died on 3 June 1989 in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England. He was in World War I and was friend to Frank Baker who would become his brother-in-law.



Ethel Brown was born on 4 June 1900 in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England. Ethel married Fred Burrows and she died in

Newbridge, Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England in 1988.

In 31 March 1901 at the time of the census the James Brown family was living on Cross Street South, Blakenhall, St. Lukes, Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England, in the Western Division as recorded on page 2. James Brown is listed as a tailor, 28 years of age, Mary Ellen is 27 years old, Annie is 4, James is 2, and Ethel is 9-16. I think this means 9 months and maybe 16 days.



Nell Brown was born on 12 November 1902 in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England. Nell married William David Benbow. She died in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England.

George Brown was born on 31 August 1906 in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England. George married Doris and died in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England.

Horace David Brown was born on 23 January 1907 in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England. Horace married Gwen and died in about 2002 in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England.

Florence Brown was born on 20 November 1909 in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England. Flossie never married and she died in 200? in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England.

The James Brown family is living at 61 Cross Street, Blakenhall, Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England at the time of the 1911 census. Living in the house are James 38, a Journeyman Tailor, Mary Ellen, 38, Annie, 14, James, 12, Ethel, 10, Nelly, 9, George Henry, 4, Horace David, 3, and Florence, 1.

Elsie May Brown was born on 3 November 1911 on Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England. Elsie married Thomas Griffiths. She died on 18 April 2006 in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England.

James Brown died on 23 May 1954 in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England.

James was a tailor by trade and raised Dalmatian dogs and carrier pigeons as a hobby. It is believed that some of his pigeons were purchased and used during WWII.

Mary Ellen Bagnell

Mary Ellen Bagnell was born on 16 June 1873 in Claverly, Shropshire, England the daughter of George Bagnell and Elizabeth Naggington.

Mary Ellen Bagnell died on 18 March 1953 in Staffordshire, England.

Mary Ellen Bagnell was living with her parents on Bone Mill Lane in April 1881 at the time of the census. She was 7 years old and is listed as a scholar, as recorded on page 32 of film # 1341671.



Mary Ellen Bagnell is living with her family at the time of the 1891 census for Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England she is listed as Mary E. age 17, a dress maker.
